Pastor's Corner

One of the scribes came near and heard them disputing with one another, and seeing that he answered them well, he asked him, "Which commandment is the first of all?" Jesus answered, "The first is, 'Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." Mark 12:28-31



As we approach Easter, we've been getting back into some of the basics of the Christian faith. Last year, we did a series about United Methodism's roots in John Wesley's theology and what that means. In Advent, we talked about the ways in which our hands offer grace through our many partnerships and ministries. This Lent, we've been talking about how God moves our feet, and we've been looking at the classic spiritual disciplines. During the time after Easter, we plan on looking at different spiritual gifts, giving you tools to identify what your giftedness might be.

But there are things even more basic than that.

God loves you.

Jesus loves you.

There is a new life waiting for you today and tomorrow and every day.

God is still at work in this church.

God is still at work in this neighborhood.

God is still at work in this city.

No matter what your history is, you have a future.

No matter what your dreams are, you and Jesus are going to have to deal with your past.

God's grace sets you free from the power that sin has over you...AND we all still need to repent and reject that power because sometimes we choose sin over God.

Loving God with our whole heart, soul, mind and strength doesn't happen overnight.

Loving ourselves is hard, but we should try to love ourselves as God loves us.

Loving our neighbors is hard, but we should try to love them as God loves them.

None of us has Jesus exactly right, but we can all learn if we listen to one another.

There is room for all of us to grow.

Your pastor also loves you and prays for you (by name when I can!) weekly if not daily.

Thomas Merton said it best: "In Louisville, at the corner of Fourth and Walnut, in the center of the shopping district, I was suddenly overwhelmed with the realization that I loved all these people, that they were mine and I theirs, that we could not be alien to one another even though we were total strangers. . . . I have the immense joy of being man, a member of a race in which God Himself became incarnate. As if the sorrows and stupidities of the human condition could overwhelm me, now that I realize what we all are. And if only everybody could realize this! But it cannot be explained. There is no way of telling people that they are all walking around shining like the sun.

... Then it was as if I suddenly saw the secret beauty of their hearts, the depths of their hearts where neither sin nor desire nor self-knowledge can reach, the core of their reality, the person that each one is in God's eyes. If only they could all see themselves as they really are. If only we could see each other that way all the time. There would be no more war, no more hatred, no more cruelty, no more greed. . . . But this cannot be seen, only believed and 'understood' by a peculiar gift."

This Easter, Jesus is your gift, to bring you new life and help you understand that he has brought new life, available to everyone.
