




To Cynthia and Clayton in the death of

¹⁵ Can a woman forget her nursing child, or show no compassion for the child of her womb?

Even these may forget, yet I will not forget you.

¹⁶ See, I have inscribed you on the palms of my hands;

your walls are continually before me. Isaiah 49:15-16 (NRSV)

There is something wonder-filled about watching a baby discover his or her hands. Those appendages start off, in general, tightly balled up and held close. They grip onto your finger when they feel it. But then they start to open up...and baby discovers that there is a wonderful toy/tool attached to her very person. And she controls it!

Then she puts them in her mouth—because really, doesn't everything go in the mouth right about then?

I wonder when a child discovers her hands can be used to help. I wonder when a child discovers those same hands can be used to harm. I wonder when a child discovers that he has fingerprints that make him unique.

In these days, are your hands weak or strong? Do they bless or do they curse? Do you ever just wonder in the unique-ness of them?

Mary Lou Redding says in her book, *While We Wait*:

"Elizabeth asks Mary, 'Why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me?' Her question reflects the wonder of realizing that God comes to us individually. And that reality is remarkable. God could herd us all together like flocks of sheep and redeem us in groups. God could

zap whole congregations and speed up the process of saving the world. But God wants relationship with each of us and so chooses to come to us one by one... Because relationships are built one person at a time, God invests time and energy in each one of us, knowing each one of us is unique and infinitely valuable."

You have unique, infinitely valuable hands, which on different days are weak and strong and blessing and cursing and working and resting and doing and praying. They are hands that you have discovered over a lifetime. And they are the extensions of your life with which God deeply desires relationship.

This Advent in worship we are contemplating different kinds of hands that do the work of God's Kingdom. On Christmas Eve, we will be thinking about all the different hands that God used to bring Jesus into this world.

But Jesus didn't just come to bless the world in general. Jesus came to reach out a hand to you—to grip your hand and guide you and have a relationship with YOU.

So whether your hands this season are full of dough or decorations or wrapping paper, grasp candles on Christmas Eve or take the hand of a family member in greeting, hold hymnals or the steering wheel of a car or a screwdriver to put together a toy—may those same hands also remind you that Jesus came for YOU. And may you, in your heart, reach out to touch God in the Baby's hand.
