Dorothy K. Burnup March 7, 1922 – January 20, 2017

Dorothy May Kirschner Burnup, 94, of Austin, Texas passed away on January 20, 2017. She was born in Austin, Texas on March 7, 1922 to Robert W. and Lilly Fox Kirschner. She was preceded in death by her parents; her husband, George W. Burnup; her son, Tommy Burnup; her brothers, J.C. and Robert Paul Kirschner; along with her sister, Rosalee Kirschner Mayes.

She is survived by her son, Mickey Burnup and his wife, Karen; her daughter Debbie Burnup Wolf and husband Marty; and her daughter-in-law, Sharon F. Burnup. She is also survived by seven grandchildren and eleven great-grandchildren.

Dorothy was raised in Austin, and graduated from S.F. Austin High School in 1940. During her high school years, she waited tables at Kirschner's Café as her Dad got his business started in downtown Austin.

On June 27, 1942, she married George W. Burnup and after his service in WWII they settled back into Texas, and George went to work with the Texas Department of Public Safety. They moved back to Austin in 1950, and built a home at the northeast edge of Austin (right behind what is now Capital Plaza) and they lived there in the same house for the next 59 years.

In retirement, George and Dorothy were an inseparable couple, from their summers in Colorado and Canada, to trips to the grocery store, they were always together. They were long time members of Memorial United Methodist Church.

Visitation was held from 1:00 p.m. until 2:00 p.m. on Saturday, January 28, 2017 at Cook-Walden/ Capital Parks Funeral Home in Pflugerville. A graveside service followed at 2:30 p.m. at Cook-Walden/Capital Parks Cemetery.

I will stand at my watch post, and station myself on the rampart; I will keep watch to see what he will say to me, and what he will answer concerning my complaint. ² Then the LORD answered me and said: Write the vision; make it plain on tablets, so that a runner may read it. ³ For there is still a vision for the appointed time; it speaks of the end, and does not lie.

If it seems to tarry, wait for it; it will surely come, it will not delay. (Habakkuk 2:1-3)

For a couple of years, I have mentored ministerial candidates—folks who are discerning whether they have a call to ordained ministry. As a part of our process, each participant and each leader is asked to try out different spiritual disciplines between each group session. They can be practices that someone has had for a long time, or they can be new ideas. The point is to learn to connect with God in different ways because you never know the season in your life when you might need a specific pattern.

One of my disciplines was to spend time each week hand-writing the scriptures for the coming Sunday. I would sit down with lined paper and breathe slowly, trying to calm myself and pray through the words, some of which I had come to know very well over the past 16 years of ministry. It was a profound interaction with the Word.

In January of this year, I realized that many of the spiritual patterns I have used were less life-giving than I had originally experienced them. I wanted a long-term project. I decided that I would handwrite the scriptures—all of them, one chapter at a time. I would write on Monday through Saturday and then on Sunday, I would spend some time in reflection on both what was happening in our church and world and what I had been writing from God's Word. With this schedule, I will finish writing the scriptures out in October of 2020.

Wanting to establish patterns before getting deeply into lists of names, I decided to start with the minor prophets. After that I will move on to Acts. I will move back and forth between sections of the Old Testament and the New Testament. As I write this, I am in the middle of the prophet Nahum. I have completed the books of Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah and Micah. By the time you receive this newsletter, I will have arrived at Habakkuk, from which the focus scripture comes. Spending time in the minor prophets has given me both a fire for justice and the somewhat sinking feeling that people have pretty much been ignoring God in some similar ways for thousands of years. But spending that time has also helped me remember that God has been faithful—that Christ is still in our midst and that there is Good News.

We are coming up on Lent, a time when we fast and repent and look to renew our discipleship. Perhaps it would be a good time for you to try out one or two new disciplines that might connect you to God. I will put some suggestions in the back of the sanctuary, or you can certainly try something on your own. If you do, please let the congregation know how it worked and how it drew you closer to the love of Christ that God has given to us and to the world. Discovering the vision may take time and different perspectives, but I believe we can all get there together. See you in worship...
